GAPA is a 501(c)(4) nonprofit social welfare organization that envisions a powerful Queer and Transgender Asian and Pacific Islander (QTAPI) community that is seen, heard, and celebrated. Our mission is to unite our families and allies to build a community through advocacy, inclusion and love.

OUR STORY

Established in 1988 by members of the Asian Gay Men's Support Group at Berkeley's Pacific Center, GAPA was formed fundamentally to build and nurture a growing gay and bisexual Asian and Pacific Islander community in the San Francisco Bay Area and to foster positive role models within our communities. For more than three decades now, generations of QTAPIs have called GAPA home, providing a safe space to be their best selves, for others to celebrate our diversity, and for all of us to continue the fight for equality. By directly engaging in social, cultural, and political advocacy and education, we are advancing and protecting our community's interests and well-being, while evolving and expanding our organizational consciousness and reach.





GAPA FUND FINANCIALS


GAPA launched **GAPA Fund** in the Fall of 2019 as GAPA's 501(c)(3) affiliate. GAPA Fund is a public charity and its mission is to provide cultural education and creative arts programs. Currently it houses **GAPA Men's Chorus**, whose account seeded the organization. Chorus had been a semi-autonomous GAPA program for 30 years. The financials below, except for the bequest, are all related to donations, events, fundraising, and revenues associated with GAPA Men's Chorus activities.
